



## Pastor's Corner

My Dear Parishioners,

As you heard announced at Masses this weekend and last, the 2017 MEMORIALS DEDICATION CALENDAR Book is now open for your requests. Last Monday morning the Parish Office was pleasantly surprised to have some prompt folks at the door with their lists in hand. On the other hand (*pun unintentional ☺*), after Mass last Sunday a younger member of our parish family stopped to ask me what the "MEMORIALS Book" was. I'm thinking something has fallen through the 'generation gap' and this may be a Spirit-guided moment for some explaining (or refreshing of memory).

Each November 2<sup>nd</sup>, All Souls Day, the Church remembers and prays for all who have walked the way of Christ and passed from this life. However, over the centuries the Church has provided for her children other opportunities to make specific intercessions for both deceased loved ones and particular concerns.

In each parish weekly bulletin there is a column announcing for whom or what intention each Mass is offered. The Celebrant mentions that intention during the Mass. The Bread and Wine and the Sanctuary Lamp for the week may also be dedicated. The love of God you are expressing when you receive Holy Communion or genuflect/bow to greet the Lord in the tabernacle may be considered a prayer for the dedicated weekly intention. In the MEMORIALS DEDICATION Book the Parish Office keeps a record of all requests as they are received. In addition to memorials for the deceased (at the time of death, yearly remembrance, or birthday), dedications may be requested for the living—healing, good health, thanksgiving, weddings, baptisms, birthdays, anniversaries, and other celebrations. Cards are available for presentation and an offering is usually made to the parish at the time of the request.

This lovely practice has been a cherished custom from time beyond memory for the best of reasons—it brings blessings to both giver and receiver as well as comfort for the bereaved. Our current 2016 calendar still has openings, also. Keep it in mind when you plan the giving of a gift.


