**Pastor's
Corner**



My Dear Parishioners,

March is the month of devotion to St. Joseph, whose feast falls on March 19th. The date of this solemnity dates to the end of the 15th century; within the next few centuries to follow, the entire month as a time for devotion to St. Joseph became part of tradition.

Joseph, someone once joked, was indeed the perfect husband: the only major character in Jesus' story who never utters a word! But the Gospel recounts and the liturgy celebrates his silent witness of faith-filled deeds: *"With a husband's love he cherished Mary, the Virgin Mother of God; with fatherly care he watched over Jesus"* (Preface of Saint Joseph, Sacramentary). Catholic devotion, therefore, hails him as patron-protector of the universal Church. Some cultures set a festive "Saint Joseph's Table," welcoming the poor and strangers to feast with family and friends.

In a society which seems to discourage the importance of marriage and fatherhood, St. Joseph, the spouse of the Virgin and the man given the responsibility of raising Jesus, is an incredible model of an obedient, faithful, Christian father.

Tradition keeps today as the anniversary of his death, which we presume was peaceful, with Jesus and Mary present. Thus, Catholics invoke Joseph as "patron of a happy death." Descended from David's house, which God finished "building" through Joseph's provision of a home for Mary and Jesus, he was, fittingly, a carpenter by trade; thus, patron of workers. Spring, nature's rebirth, begins between his feast and Annunciation (March 25), appropriately, since Joseph's silent obedience and Mary's *"Let it be done to me according to your word"* (Luke 1:38) usher in humanity's spiritual rebirth.

MARCH—WOMEN IN HISTORY MONTH

Dolores Hope was born in Harlem to an Irish mother and an Italian father. She worked as a professional singer in New York City and married Bob Hope, the comedian, in 1934.

Despite being a talented vocalist, Dolores took time out of her career to raise four adopted children. She appeared in many of her husband's television shows and on occasion accompanied him on his tours entertaining American troops. One Christmas they were entertaining the troops in Vietnam and Dolores performed "Silent Night" with such feeling that it reduced many of the soldiers to tears. That is but one example of how Dolores impressed others with her profound love of God. She also had an abiding passion for improving the lives of others and was known as a champion of Catholic charities. The Archdiocese of Los Angeles benefited regularly from her generous donations. The Hope's home had a chapel, and Dolores had a little way of encouraging their celebrity friends to read Catholic spirituality books.

John Paul II gave Bob and Dolores the honour of being a Knight and Dame of St Gregory the Great. Dolores was one of the very few women in the world to achieve this, along with Phyllis Bowman.

Dolores enjoyed a revival of her singing career in 1993 and recorded five albums. She died in 2011, aged 102.
